MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

2022 is going way too fast! It only seems like yesterday that I had the opportunity of catching up with over 50 carers at the Big Day Out in May. It was great seeing everyone and I appreciated all the efforts families made to travel from the South and NW of the State to be at this event. It was another great day. The YMCA has now officially closed after 100 years so we will change locations next year for the BDO.

A few things to update you all on. I represented FKAT before the Commission of Inquiry into the Tasmanian Government's Responses to Child Sexual Abuse in Institutional Settings. This Commission was established on 15 March 2021 by the Governor of Tasmania. I advocated to the three Commissioners around registration, accreditation, training and an independent Tribunal to appeal decisions by the Department. The Commission is equivalent to a royal commission and is independent of the Tasmanian Government. Under its Terms of Reference, the Commission's inquiry will focus on the adequacy and appropriateness of the Tasmanian Government's current responses to allegations and incidents of child sexual abuse in institutional contexts. Victimsurvivors, their supporters and other people who wish to provide information directly to a Commissioner can register to attend a session with a Commissioner.

Sessions will allow people to speak directly with a Commissioner about their experience and any views they may have about what needs to change to prevent child sexual abuse and improve responses to, and reporting of, abuse in institutional settings.

The Commission will submit its report and recommendations to the Governor of Tasmania by 1 May 2022. Information may be found at https://commissionofinquiry.tas.gov.au/home.

The next important update is that The Children, Young Persons and Their Families Act 1997 will be reviewed this year. I have joined the Advisory Group to represent carers and provide feedback into the review of legislative process. If carers have any issues, concerns, believe there are gaps in the legislation or questions that they would like me to raise during the process please contact me by phone or email.

On 21 June, a Child and Youth Safe Organisations Framework Project team met for the first time to discuss a framework. I will sit on the project team and be involved with this project as well to represent carers and will provide information as the project starts to roll out.

If anyone is interested in attending that National Conference/International Conference in Darwin in September, please let me know as soon as possible as accommodation is becoming difficult to source and we need to have everything finalised by 1 August 22.

I also had the opportunity to meet with the Acting Deputy Secretary, of Child Youth Services on 20th June and planned to meet again before the end of school term. I spent time discussing the increases to cost of living and ask her to consider given inflation and overall cost of living. I will continue to have this discussion with the Department moving forward.

Keep up the great work that you all do everyone. I look forward to seeing you all in Foster Carers Week which will commence on Saturday 10 September. We are holding a collaborative event at Camp Clayton on the day and should be so much fun. All welcome. See Flyer for details. Other events will be held State-wide also.

Ken Abery 21.09.1938- 05.05.2022

On behalf of FKAT and on a personal level, I would like to acknowledge the passing of Ken Abery, former President of FCAT.

Ken, a well-known foster carer from Hobart, along with his wife Sheila, fostered for many years in the area, respected by many. Ken and Sheila were awarded a life membership by the board of FKAT.

Ken was very passionate about bringing changes to the foster care system and would lobby whenever the opportunity arose.

Those carers who have been around for many years would remember Ken and his desire to see carers issues highlighted so they would feel part of a team and not "just a carer".

Ken was chair/president for FCAT (now known as FKAT) for several years here in Tasmania he was also chair/president of AFCA the national body (now known as the National Collective) and was involved along with AFCA board members in discussing the importance of a national standard for Australian carers.

Ken on behalf of the FCAT board at the time was successful in receiving a funding grant to implement F.A.S.T. in Tasmania, Ken invited Foster Carers to attend training with Brian Smith from Queensland.

On a personal level I worked closely with Ken not only as a board member, also as the secretary of the FCAT board and I learned a great deal from Ken, as Ken was a great organiser and was always wanting the job done professionally. I didn't always agree with Ken, and vice versa however the job always got done.


Coffee Buzz food van provided carers and children with a delicious luncheon and Banjos Kings Meadows platters meant no one left with an empty tummy.

Circle Of Security Parenting Program - free training for carers

Speech Pathology Tasmania is thrilled to partner with the Foster and Kinship Carers Association of Tasmania to offer the Circle of Security Program to grandparents raising grandchildren, informal kin, and Foster & Kinship Carers.

This program explores the development of connection, relationship and attachment – which are also foundations for language development, social skills development and good mental health. SPT has been running these sessions in their clinic for around 10 years. "We love the warm, accepting, non-judgmental, non-blaming approach to exploring attachment." Says facilitator Rosie Martin.

This is a valuable training opportunity with learnings that can be applied to all relationships at any age or stage. The course involves meeting in a small group online via zoom, once a week for 8 sessions. FKAT will fund each participant to undertake the course. A group specifically for FKAT participants will take place on Wed mornings during term 3. FKAT will also sponsor places in the term 2 Tues evening group which is open to the public.

OK, so a nest is a home - Launch

The Commissioner for Children and Young People Leanne McLean today launched a new book, '<u>OK, so a nest is a home – Views and experiences of Tasmanian children and young people in out-of-home care</u>'.

Ms McLean said an important part of her role as Commissioner is to promote and empower the participation of children and young people in the making of decisions, or the expressing of opinions, on matters that may affect their lives – including children living in Out of Home Care in Tasmania which includes foster care, kinship care and residential care in Tasmania.

"Every night, about 1100 Tasmanian children and young people are in out-of-home care. That is about 1 in every 100 or 1% of children and young people in communities across the State," Ms McLean said.

"In 2021-22, as part of my Out-of-Home Care Monitoring Program, it was my great pleasure to undertake a series of creative consultations and discussions with children and young people with a care experience to explore the theme of 'Being Loved and Safe'.

"These consultations also delivered stunning artworks and candid quotes about young Tasmanians' experiences and views about out-of-home care.

"These have been brought together, with the help of the creative organisation *All That We Are*, in a beautiful picture book."

Ms McLean said **OK**, so a nest is a home provides an easily accessible and honest insight into the lives of Tasmanian children and young people with a care experience.

"Later this year my office will release a report around the theme of Being Loved and Safe. But right now, I want to draw everyone's focus to what Tasmanian children and young people have told me themselves about the safety and stability of their lives."


