I have been involved in providing ongoing assistance with informal carers in South, North & North-West and provided significant ongoing assistance with two Wellbeing in Care Concerns in the South.

It is very exciting that FKAT now has an office space in Launceston two days a week and I would encourage carers to make an appointment to pop in and see Anita for support or upcoming meetings.

I hope you are well and I look forward to seeing many of you in the coming months.



Fostering Hope Free, Online, Trauma Awareness Training

As carers we know how much it means for our kids to have 'normal' childhoods, being able to go to school, participate in after school activities, be invited to birthday parties, and have friends over to play. Yet, often, our children's behaviours can be barriers to participation, and we know it's not their fault and it's also not intentional by others. As a carer, l've found giving people enough information about the impacts of trauma without overwhelming them can increase their compassion and willingness to also care for our children. With the support of the Tasmanian Community Fund, Fostering Hope partnered with Dr Suse from Shine Through Psychology to develop easy to understand, free, online trauma awareness videos to encourage people already working and volunteering with children and young people and increase their understanding of the impacts of unsafe beginnings. We hope this resource is something you can share with family, friends, teachers, coaches, and others to increase their understanding of the children living in your home. The course consists of six videos that take about an hour total.
